

Diamond Don's AHRMA Vintage National Motocross COVID-19 Guidelines

Last revised August 7, 2020

Diamond Dons Motorsports, Inc. (DDMX) uses its best efforts to comply with Governor Abbott's Executive Orders and requirements of Texas Health and Human Services as well as local, state and federal guidelines and the generally accepted attention to public health.

Please self-screen before coming to this event. If you are sick or have been exposed to anyone with COVID-19, please stay home.

Enter the Diamond Don RV Park at your own risk. We are not responsible for illness or injury.

Every person entering the Diamond Don RV Park and racing facility will be required to sign three waivers: (1) AHRMA's Communicable Disease Exposure and Infection Assumption of Risk, Hold Harmless, Release, Waiver of Liability and Indemnity Agreement; (2) the Insurance Company required waiver; and (3) DDMX Rules of the Road & Waiver. These documents are posted on our website. You can download, print and bring with you to give to RV Office registration staff to reduce your time in the RV Office. Health and safety messaging will be prominent throughout the facility.

Social Distancing: When in the DDMX RV Park and when participating in any of the scheduled events, you may not be able to social distance 6-feet from other people outside your party. If such distancing is not feasible, other measures such as face covering, hand hygiene, cough etiquette, cleanliness, and sanitation should be rigorously practiced.

Everyone entering the RV Park should follow Governor Abbott's Executive Order GA-29:

Every person in Texas shall wear a face covering over the nose and mouth when inside a commercial entity or other building or space open to the public, or when in an outdoor public space, wherever it is not feasible to maintain six feet of social distancing from another person not in the same household; provided, however, that this face-covering requirement does not apply to the following:

1. any person younger than 10 years of age;
2. any person with a medical condition or disability that prevents wearing a face covering;
3. any person while the person is consuming food or drink, or is seated at a restaurant to eat or drink;
4. any person while the person is (a) exercising outdoors or engaging in physical activity outdoors, and (b) maintaining a safe distance from other people not in the same household;
5. any person while the person is giving a speech for a broadcast or to an audience; or
6. any person in a county (a) that meets the requisite criteria promulgated by TDEM regarding minimal cases and (b) whose judge has affirmatively opted-out of this face-covering requirement.

as well as Texas Health and Human Services Health protocols:

1. Maintain at least 6 feet separation from other individuals not within the same household. If such distancing is not feasible, other measures such as face covering, hand hygiene, cough etiquette, cleanliness, and sanitation should be rigorously practiced.
2. Self-screen before going into a business for any of the following new or worsening signs or symptoms of possible COVID-19:
 - a. Cough
 - b. Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
 - c. Chills
 - d. Muscle pain
 - e. Headache
 - f. Sore throat
 - g. Loss of taste or smell
 - h. Diarrhea
 - i. Feeling feverish or measured temperature greater than or equal to 100.0 degrees Fahrenheit
 - j. Known close contact with a person who is lab-confirmed to have COVID-19
3. Wash or disinfect hands upon entering a business and after any interaction with employees, other customers, or items in the business.
4. Consider wearing cloth face coverings (over the nose and mouth) when entering a business, or when within 6 feet of another person who is not a member of the individual's household.

Payment of Gate Fees and signing waivers at entrance to RV Park:

1. We recommend that you print and sign the three (3) release forms (available on our website) and bring with you to reduce your time in the RV Office.
2. We accept cash, credit or checks payable to Diamond Dons Motorsports.
3. Registration staff onsite will sit behind Plexiglas shields.
4. Only one family group at a time is allowed in the RV Office for registration. Face coverings may be required, per GA-29 order outlined above. RV staff will not question patrons not wearing a face covering as we will assume that you are exempt under the Governor's Orders. We will not provide face coverings – so bring your own.
5. You can bring your own pen or we will provide sanitized pens.
6. We will sanitize the desk, pens and credit card iPad between each group.
7. Please maintain 6-foot social distancing while you are waiting to enter the RV Office. Wait for our registration clerk to signal you to approach the desk and use handwipe or sanitizer as you approach.

Parking: Park with at least 6' of space on either side of your vehicle. If you are camping, we recommend that only individuals traveling with you are allowed around your campsite with no more than 10 people in attendance. If social distancing cannot be maintained, then we recommend other measures such as face covering, hand hygiene, cough etiquette, cleanliness, and sanitation be rigorously practiced.

Race Sign-up: Online registration is strongly encouraged. Visit www.AHRMA.org to pre-register. Registration staff onsite will sit behind Plexiglas shields. We suggest bringing your own pen for the Waiver/Release form and Rider Information Sheet. We will have sanitized pens available in the event you forget to bring one. We accept cash or checks payable to Diamond Dons Motorsports. Entrants should not bring anyone else into the sign-up area. There will be one-way traffic in and out of sign up. Participants will need to maintain 6-ft social distancing from others while in the area. Face coverings are recommended pursuant to Governor Abbott's Executive Order GA-29.

Food: We will have food vendors at the RV Park. Please practice appropriate hygienic standards and social distancing. Please consider wearing a face covering if you will be within 6-feet of anyone outside your family group.

Tech Inspection: Entrants will have machines ready for inspection. Riders should practice social distancing when waiting in line. Tech inspectors will wear PPE appropriate to the situation. National and local tech directors may modify this process to accommodate local entries and circumstances.

Rider Meetings: The rider meetings will be held in the Diamond Don Event Center. Please maintain 6-ft social distancing or practice other measures such as face covering, hand hygiene, and cough etiquette. The rider meetings will also be announced over the outdoor speakers and through the on-track FM broadcasting system.

Starting line: If possible, stay on your bike. Maintain 6-foot distance between you and other racers in staging. Do not bring family or team members to the staging/start line. Our start line crew will make best efforts to remain 6-feet away from racers.

Results/Award Ceremony: The awards ceremony will be held in the Diamond Don Event Center approximately 30 minutes after final scores are posted. Please maintain 6-ft social distancing or practice other measures such as face covering, hand hygiene, and cough etiquette. There are restrooms and a hand-washing station in the pavilion.

Group Meetings in the Diamond Don Event Center: All events in connection with DDMX 2020 will be conducted as we have done in the past. i.e., Friday Rhumbar, Meet and Greet and Sunday Church Service and Wine-Down Party. It is important for attendees to self-screen and not participate in activities if they are experiencing any signs or symptoms of possible COVID-19. DDMX staff and volunteers will follow all recommended hygiene standards and will frequently use hand-sanitizer and sanitize frequently touched surfaces. Participants should use best efforts to social distance or practice other measures such as face covering, hand hygiene, and cough etiquette.

General steps you can take to minimize risk of transmission:

Wash hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. We will group portable toilets together and have a hand-washing station beside each group. If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer. (Bring your own hand sanitizer). Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands. Avoid close contact with others. Do not shake hands with others for the time being. Wear a face mask if social distancing isn't possible or practice other measures such hand hygiene, and cough etiquette.

We have staff assigned specifically to clean and disinfect restrooms, showers, portable toilets and frequently touched objects and surfaces. We ensure that employees have ample facilities to wash their hands, including tepid water and soap, and provide alcohol-based hand rubs containing at least 60% alcohol where hand-washing is not available. Worksite access will be limited to only essential workers, if possible.

Your health and safety are important to us. Our staff has a heightened sense of awareness of the importance of maintaining hygienic standards. Please comply with all standards set out in this guideline and comply with orders from Governor Abbott, as well as CDC and DSHS requirements.
